But Jesus did not stay dead; He rose from his tomb! So, we are actually celebrating Jesus' death for our sins and His resurrection. That is why many people call Easter, Resurrection Sunday, because that is exactly what it

HAPPY AND BLESSED EASTER TO ALL

"Kenosis" derives from the Greek word "kenoo" which means "to empty." It is used in <a href="Phil. 2:7">Phil. 2:7</a>. The text of <a href="Phil. 2:5-8">Phil. 2:5-8</a> is worth recording here. "Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in <a href="Christ">Christ</a> Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with <a href="God">God</a> a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men but sin. <sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross," (<a href="Phil. 2:5-8">Phil. 2:5-8</a>). The passage from <a href="Phil. 2:5-8">Phil. 2:5-8</a> does not teach that Jesus gave up any of His divine attributes (omniscience, omnipresence, and omnipotence), instead, it is speaking of His humility that moved him, according to the will of the Father, to leave His majestic state in heaven and enter into the humble position of human nature.

There is, however, a problem the one must deal with that the Kenosis theory seems to more adequately address. Take Mark 13:32 for example. In it, Jesus said, "But of that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone." If Jesus knew all things, as is implied in His divine nature, then why did He not know the day or hour of His own return. The answer is that Jesus cooperated with the limitations of humanity and voluntarily did not exercise His attribute of omniscience. He still was divine but was moving and living completely as a man. The correct doctrine is the Hypostatic Union, that Jesus is both fully God and fully man (Col. 2:9) and did not give up any divine attributes while as a man on earth.

**The hypostatic union** is the term used to describe how God the Son, Jesus Christ, took on a human nature, yet remained fully God at the same time. Jesus always had been God (<u>John 8:58</u>, <u>10:30</u>), but at the incarnation Jesus became a human being (<u>John 1:14</u>). The addition of the human nature to the divine nature is Jesus, the God-man. This is the hypostatic union, Jesus Christ, one Person, fully God and fully man.



There is a story told about a journey Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin, a Russian communist leader took from Moscow to Kiev in 1930 to address a huge assembly on the subject of atheism. Addressing the crowd he aimed his heavy artillery at Christianity hurling insult, argument, and proof against it. An hour later his lecture was finished. He looked out at what seemed to be the smouldering ashes of men's faith. "Are there any questions?" Bukharin demanded. Deafening silence filled the auditorium but then one man approached the platform and mounted the lectern standing near the communist leader. He surveyed the crowd first to the left then to the right. Finally he shouted the ancient greeting known well in the Russian Orthodox Church: "CHRIST IS RISEN!" En masse the crowd arose as one man and the response came crashing like the sound of thunder: "HE IS RISEN INDFFD!"

I say to you this morning: CHRIST IS RISEN! (congregational response should be: HE IS RISEN INDEED!). I am convinced! I have faith that Christ was dead and he was buried. That I believe. But, this too I accept as true: He rose from the dead and will come again in glory.



As the Royal Commission begins its work soon, let us pray for the Divine blessings and inspiration in funding spirit of justice, support and healing for the heartbroken victims and forgiveness for the offenders.
