#### **Resumption of Public Masses**

Under eased COVID-19 restrictions from July 1, church attendance numbers are now unlimited, providing there is a four square metre space around each person, with the exception of people from the same household. Attendance at funerals are now unlimited, providing the four square metre rule is followed while weddings may still allow a maximum of 20 guests, unless a church can accommodate more guests while ensuring the four square metre rule is followed. All parishes must ensure that their churches are not left unattended when their doors are open and must keep written records with names and contact details of everyone who comes into the church at any time and these records must be kept for at least 4 weeks.

## Excerpt from July Letter from Archbishop Anthony Fisher regarding relaxed restrictions during the COVID-19 pandemic:

"All entering the church must be recorded. Current spatial distancing directions and hygiene directions must be observed; attendees are to sit only in marked places, to queue at a distance from others, and to take care when coughing or sneezing. Congregational singing is suspended. Great care should be taken when exercising the option of Communion on the tongue. Those who are unwell or at high risk must not attend (they might ask that Holy Communion be brought to them at home); those over 70 should exercise particular caution..."

#### **Saint Bonaventure**

St Bonaventure (Giovanni Di Fidanza) known as the Seraphic Doctor was born near Tuscany in 1221. He received the name Bonaventure in consequence of an explanation of St Francis of Assisi when in response to the pleading of the child's mother, the saint prayed for John's recovery from a dangerous illness, and foreseeing the future greatness of the little John, cried out "O Buona ventura"-O good fortune. He was good friends with St Thomas Aquinas and at the age of 22, entered the Franciscan order. At 35, he was General of the Order. He offered the Friars an organized spirituality based on the vision and insights of Saint Francis. Through his preaching and good works, he converted even hardened sinners. He was an Italian medieval scholastic theologian, philosopher and Cardinal and Bishop of Albano. He died on 15th July 1274. The Pope and all the bishops deeply lamented his early death, but God immediately honoured him by many miracles. One hundred and sixty years later, when on account of the erection of a new Church, the relics of the Saint were exhumed, it was found that the flesh of the body was entirely consumed, the head excepted, of which the hair, teeth, tongue, eyes and ears, lips and cheeks, were as perfect as though he had still been living. The head, therefore, was preserved in a rich shrine, and the rest of the body laid into a coffin. After many years, when the Huguenots or Calvinists took possession of Lyons, they publicly burned the body of the Saint and threw the ashes into the river. The holy head, however, was saved from their rage by the care of a priest, who, though most cruelly tortured, to make him confess where the relic was kept, preferred to bear the suffering rather than reveal where the precious treasure was concealed.
