COVID-19 Update

Restrictions on church attendance have been eased further to allow for up to 300 attendees at Masses, as long as churches follow a four square metre rule. It is important to acknowledge that in practice, only St Mary's Cathedral will be allowed up to 300 attendees because of its dimensions. A small number of churches with larger dimensions will now be able to accommodate over 100 people at Masses.

The latest easing of restrictions has also impacted upon the celebration of some sacraments such as weddings, baptisms and funerals. You'll find more information here:

St Francis Xavier

St. Francis Xavier was a Spanish Jesuit who lived as a Roman Catholic missionary in the 1500s. He was one of St. Ignatius Loyola's closest friends. He was one of the first seven members of the Jesuit order and travelled extensively, particularly in India, Southeast Asia, and Japan, to share his faith. He is the patron saint of Roman Catholic missions. he has been acclaimed as one of the greatest missionaries in history. The relic of St Francis Xavier - his right forearm, with which he baptised many thousands of people came to St Michael's Parish on 2nd December, 2012. Millions have been touched for the good by his work and its legacy over many generations.
