## Plenary Indulgence for Feast of all Souls' Day during the month of November

This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence (Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions). May They Rest In Peace.

## COVID-19 Safety Plan

Our Covid-19 Safety Plan (copy available in Church) states :

1. All must be aware of content of Safety Plan.
2. Those with Flu symptoms must not enter the Church.
3. Sanitizing hands and registration strict requirement in order to come inside the Church.
4. Vaccinated members of the congregation are permitted to sing, but masks must still be worn.
5. Required sanitization of the seats before and after mass.
6. Holy Communion on hand. Keep 2sqm distance when receiving communion.
7. Social distancing, one person per 2sqm.

**St Elizabeth of Hungary**

Elizabeth of Hungary, also known as Saint Elizabeth of Thuringia was a princess of the Kingdom of Hungary, Landgravine of Thuringia, Germany, and a greatly venerated Catholic saint who was an early member of the Third Order of St. Francis, by which she is honoured as its patroness. At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing. Daily she would take bread to hundreds of the poorest in the land who came to her gate.

One day when Ludwig was out with a hunting party, they returned to the castle to find Elizabeth carrying a mysterious handful underneath her cloak. Members of the hunting party immediately suspected Elizabeth was stealing something from the king and her husband asked to see what she carried. At the time Elizabeth was carrying an armful of food to give to the poor, but when she opened her cloak a bouquet of magnificent red and white roses fell from her hands. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. Her great popularity resulted in her canonization four years later.

**The Feast of Christ the King**

The Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King, also called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. The Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Originally, it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, but Pope Paul VI in 1969 revised the Liturgical Calendar, and it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time (immediately preceding Advent, where its theme of Christ's dominion made it a fitting end to the liturgical year
