History of Lent

Lent means "the 40 weekdays from Ash Wednesday to Easter. This name comes from the "Old English lencten springtime, spring" and "from West Germanic langitinaz long-days or lengthening of the day." Christians honour the 40 days and nights following Christ's baptism when He went into the wilderness without water and food and was tempted by Satan. During that time, Christ did what we do today when we fast: wrestle with temptation. This was not the first fast; biblical figures often fasted when petitioning God for something important.. The Israelites "mourned and wept and fasted till evening for Saul and his son Jonathan, and for the army of the LORD and for the nation of Israel, because they had fallen by the sword" (2 Samuel 1:12). Since the early origins of Lent, early Christians gave up food or money in order to imitate Christ's obedience to the Father.

Ash Wednesday, is the first day of Lent, where Christians mark their foreheads with ash as a symbol of sorrow and mourning over their sin.

Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes (Daniel 9:3)

Lenten Observance-ASH WEDNESDAY 22nd February, 2023

- 1. Abstinence from meat, and fasting, *must be* observed on <u>Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.</u> All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.
- 2. On all other Fridays of the year including the Fridays of Lent, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:
- (a) prayer for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the rosary.
- (b) self-denial for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country; limiting use of social media, smart phones or television.
- (c) helping others for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.

Lent lasts from ASH WEDNESDAY (22nd February, 2023) to the MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER (6th April, 2023). On GOOD FRIDAY and, if possible on HOLY SATURDAY until THE EASTER VIGIL, THE EASTER FAST IS OBSERVED.

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday, 22nd February, 2023, and Trinity Sunday (4th June 2023). All the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year
