Stop the so-called 'equality' bill.



The NSW parliamentary committee report into the so-called 'equality' bill had been released. Despite its name, the 'equality' bill is about entrenching unequal treatment. The bill proposes: to remove the few existing protections for religious institutions from antidiscrimination lawfare, including schools, healthcare, aged care, welfare and pastoral services, while offering no protections at all for individuals of faith; seeks to remove public decency safeguards around

prostitution, making it permissible for a person to engage in solicitation even outside a church or school; would allow self-identification of sex on official documents such as birth certificates, to allow international commercial surrogacy, risking the exploitation of women, especially in poorer countries; and allowing children to undergo life-altering medical treatments without parental consent, exposing children to interventions they may well later regret. Even the 85% rejection was not enough for the parliamentary committee to recommend the bill be shelved. Instead, debate on this bill could begin as soon as 20 June, so there is no time to lose. We need to once again make our voices heard, this time by telling our local MPs to reject the so-called 'equality' bill in its entirety. St Thomas More—22nd June

Thomas More, also known as Saint Thomas More, was a remarkable figure in history. Born in London in 1478, More was a lawyer, philosopher, author, and statesman. Thomas More enjoyed a close friendship with King Henry VIII, who respected More's intellect and appointed him as his Chancellor. Their friendship was strained when More strongly opposed Henry's decision to break away from the Catholic Church. Thomas More's loyalty to his principles led him to refuse to acknowledge Henry VIII as the Head of the Church of England and to oppose the annulment of the king's marriage to Catherine of Aragon. As a result, he was tried for treason and executed in 1535. Pope Pius XI canonised More in *1935* as a martyr. Pope John Paul II in 2000 declared him the patron saint of statesmen and politicians.
