Remembrance Day—11th November

At 5am on 11 November 1918, three German government representatives accepted the Armistice terms presented to them by an allied commander, General Ferdinand Foch of the French Army. The Armistice became effective at 11am the same day and the 4-year long First World War ended. After World War II the Australian Government agreed to

the United Kingdom's proposal that Armistice Day be renamed Remembrance Day to commemorate those who were killed in both World Wars. In October 1997 the then Governor-General issued a Proclamation declaring 11 November as Remembrance Day - a day to remember the sacrifice of those who have died for Australia in wars and conflicts.

St Elizabeth of Hungary

Elizabeth of Hungary, also known as Saint Elizabeth of Thuringia was a princess of the Kingdom of Hungary, Landgravine of Thuringia, Germany, and a greatly venerated Catholic saint who was an early member of the Third Order of St. Francis, by which she is honoured as its patroness. At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing. Daily she would take bread to hundreds of the poorest in the land who came to her gate. One day when Ludwig was out with a hunting party, they returned to the castle to find Elizabeth carrying a mysterious handful underneath her cloak. Members of the hunting party immediately suspected Elizabeth was stealing something from the king and her husband asked to see what she carried. At the time Elizabeth was carrying an armful of food to give to the poor, but when she opened her cloak a bouquet of magnificent red and white roses fell from her hands. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. Her great popularity resulted in her canonization four years later.

The Feast of Christ the King

The Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King, also called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. The Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Originally, it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, but Pope Paul VI in 1969 revised the Liturgical Calendar, and it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time (immediately preceding Advent, where its theme of Christ's dominion made it a fitting end to the liturgical year.
