#### **Interesting Facts about Easter**

"Easter is the most important liturgical time for Catholics. It celebrates Jesus's victory of sin and death and salvation for mankind. It is God's greatest act of love to redeem mankind." The celebration of the Easter Vigil is the beginning of the season of Easter. Easter is a moveable feast, meaning it has no fixed date. The Easter season is the second-longest liturgical season. Only ordinary time is longer. It is the beginning of a new season of grace and a time of joy and thanksgiving. It is a fifty day celebration from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. "The word 'Easter' comes from Old English, meaning simply the 'East.' The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world." (USCCB) The period of Easter Sunday until Divine Mercy Sunday (or, the second Sunday of Easter) is called the Octave of Easter. The feast of Christ's Ascension into Heaven falls on the 40th day of Easter. According to many sources, the Christian custom of Easter eggs started among the early Christians of Mesopotamia, who stained them with red colouring "in memory of the blood of Christ", shed at His crucifixion. Some Christians symbolically link the cracking open of Easter eggs with the empty tomb of Jesus. Chocolate eggs first appeared at the court of Louis XIV in Versailles in 1725. In 1875, Cadbury created the modern chocolate Easter egg. Cadbury spends 10 months' of the year making its 270 million chocolate eggs and chocolate bunnies for Easter. The Easter bunny also has origins in Germany among German Lutherans who depicted that children who were well behaved would be rewarded with Easter eggs on Easter Sunday. Purple dye was a prized commodity in the ancient society. Purple apparel was very expensive and often only worn by kings, other royal members, or those with highranking authority. This is why, in mocking Jesus before His crucifixion, the soldiers dressed Jesus in a purple robe and purple is used for the colour of Lent and Easter.
