## **Advent Prayer**

My loving Jesus, I choose You, this Advent, as my King and my God. I abandon myself to You and seek to put all my trust in Your tender care. Draw me close to You and free me from my sin so that I may love You with a pure and holy heart.

#### **Advent**

According to Saint Gregory of Tours the celebration of Advent began in the fifth century when the Bishop Perpetuus directed that starting with the St. Martin's Day on 11 November until Christmas, one fasts three times per week; this is why Advent was sometimes also named "Lent of St. Martin". The first day of Advent is the first day of a new Liturgical (or church) calendar and begins a four week period of preparation in anticipation of the nativity of Jesus at Christmas. The Advent Season is about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. It is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth is. The four Sundays of Advent proclaim aspects of our divine nature—hope and faith, peace, love, and joy. The traditional themes of Advent allow us—through meditation, prayer, and affirmation—to contemplate ways to share our deepest gifts: hope and faith, peace, love, and joy.

Advent calendars first originated in the 1800's and were initially used as a tool to help "focus" Christians for the period of advent. They were initially started in Germany where chalk marks were made on doors, or candles were lit, counting the days leading up to Christmas.

The first printed advent calendar was made in the 1900's by Gerhard Lang. His calendar was created after being inspired by a calendar his mother made for him. It featured 24 coloured pictures that attached to a piece of cardboard. Overtime he modified his calendars so that they included little doors that are common in the advent calendars used today.

Advent Calendar Fact: Advent Calendars don't actually count the period of advent, instead they begin on December 1 and count the 24 days before Christmas.
