St Thomas Aquinas—28th January

St. Thomas Aquinas was the greatest of the Scholastic philosophers. He produced a comprehensive synthesis of Christian theology and Aristotelian philosophy that influenced Roman Catholic doctrine for centuries and was adopted as the official philosophy of the church in 1917. He was a gentle giant, known for his humility and kindness to others. Thomas grew up in a castle in Roccasecca, Italy. He had three brothers and five sisters. When he was a toddler, his infant sister was killed by lightning when they were both taking a nap in the same room. Later in life, Thomas always carried a relic of St. Agnes and prayed to her for protection during storms. At the age of five he was placed in the care of the Benedictines of Monte Casino. When his family found out he had joined the Dominicans, a band of soldiers led by his brother Rinaldo captured Thomas and brought him back home. He spent about a year under a sort of house arrest while his family tried to persuade him to give up his dream. He did not. Thomas studied at the Monastery of Mount Cassino where he got to know the spiritual writings of Saint John Cassian, which he treasured throughout his life. After becoming a priest he was sent to Paris. In Paris he became a friend of the King, St. Louis, dining with him frequently. He was asked to teach at the age of 22. He has published many writings. The most well known are Summa Theologica and Summa Contra Gentiles. St. Thomas studied at Cologne under St. Albert the Great. His well known hymns are the following:

- 1. Panis Angelicus (Bread of Angels)
- 2. Adore te Devote (Humbly I adore thee)...Gregorian Chant
- 3. O Salutaris hostia (O saving victim) Gregorian Chant
- **4.** Pange Lingua Corperis (Now, my tongue, the mystery telling) **Gregorian Chant 5.** Tantum Ergo Sacramentum (Come Adore)

St John Bosco—31st January

John Bosco, also known as Don Bosco, was canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church due to his significant contributions to the welfare and education of young people, particularly those from poor and disadvantaged backgrounds.. After his prayers on their behalf, the deaf heard, the lame walked, and once, a dead boy was raised to life. He had the gift of prophecy. He could read consciences, and used this gift to assist penitents in confession. Fr. Bosco died on January 31, 1888. The call for his canonization was immediate. Pope Pius XI knew Fr. Bosco personally and agreed, declaring him blessed in 1929. St. John Bosco was canonized on Easter Sunday, 1934 and he was given the title, "Father and Teacher of Youth." In 2002, Pope John Paul II was petitioned to declare St. John Bosco the Patron of Stage Magicians. St. Bosco had pioneered the art of what is to-day called "Gospel Magic," using magic and other feats to attract attention and engage the youth. Saint John Bosco is the patron saint of apprentices, editors and publishers, schoolchildren, magicians, and juvenile delinquents.
