Saint Mark — Feast day 26th April

St. Mark, also called John Mark, was a cousin of St. Barnabas, an influential leader in the early Church and companion of St. Paul on his missionary journeys. (Col. 4:10). The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, with only 16 chapters. It is believed to have been written around 65-70 AD. Saint Mark was a disciple of Saint Peter and his Gospel was based on the apostle's teachings and testimonies. St. Mark's house in Jerusalem is believed to be the site of the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist, and also the place where the disciples gathered after the Resurrection (Acts 12:12). Saint Mark is represented by a winged lion, symbol of Christ's royalty and resurrection. This symbol is inspired by the book of Ezekiel and the Apocalypse. St Mark is represented by the winged lion for two reasons: He begins his Holy Gospel by describing John the Baptist as a lion roaring in the desert (Mk 1:3). His famous story with a lion, as related to us by Severus Ebn-El-Mokafa: Once a lion and lioness appeared to John Mark and his father Arostalis while they were traveling in Jordan. The father was very scared and begged his son to escape, while he awaited his fate. John Mark assured his father that Jesus Christ would save them and began to pray. The two beasts fell dead and as a result of this miracle, the father believed in Christ.

Preaching with the Apostles, Saint Mark is considered the founder of the Church in Egypt, specifically the Coptic Orthodox Church. He would have been the first bishop of Alexandria, where he suffered martyrdom around AD 68. The relics of St. Mark were supposedly taken from Alexandria to Venice in 828 AD and deposited in St. Mark's Basilica. Saint Mark is the patron saint of Venice, and his figure is closely associated with the city's history and identity. The winged lion of Saint Mark is an iconic symbol of Venice and is found on many of the city's buildings and monuments.
